

# **Deputy Director – K-12**

Job Description

#### **Position**

The Hunt Institute is seeking a Deputy Director for K-12 to support and manage the implementation of major K-12 initiatives and projects, including our strategy for engaging with state education agencies, and overseeing our strategy around national trends, best practices, and new research in K-12 education to be infused in Institute-led conversations and convenings. The Deputy Director will report directly to the Director of K-12. The position is based out of The Hunt Institute's office in Cary, North Carolina.

### Responsibilities

- Oversee K-12's policy strategy, ensuring we stay ahead of trends and best practices in K-12 and identifying opportunities to host engaging conversations with our stakeholders.
- Support the Director of K-12 in our strategy around engaging with state education agencies, including introducing The Hunt Institute to new and existing state superintendents; as well as the identification of major funder opportunities.
- Oversee K-12 specific events, such as our State Education Leaders Retreat, Education Datathon, and others.
- Serve as a subject matter expert on K-12 and represent The Hunt Institute at internal and external convenings, both in-person and virtual.
- Maintain project schedules and timelines, delegating tasks, identifying dependencies, and driving awareness and crisp execution against major due dates.
- Create and maintain strong relationships with state superintendents and departments of education, partners, and funders.
- Partner with Director of K-12 on development efforts, including grant applications, proposals, reports, and assessment of impact of new funding on current work.
- Supervise and mentor direct report staff, including communicating clear expectations, setting
  performance objectives, establishing a supportive environment while emphasizing
  accountability, providing regular and timely constructive performance feedback, and leading
  documented semi-annual performance reviews.
- Work with and across The Institute's national programs teams to manage cross-function, highimpact initiatives and programs that enable The Institute to achieve its mission and grant deliverables.
- Other duties as assigned.

- Commitment to the mission and vision of The Hunt Institute, alongside a passion for challenging entrenched systems of educational inequity towards the bettering of public education for all children.
- In-depth knowledge of state and national K-12 education policy.
- Exceptional project management skills with a proven track record of moving complex projects from big ideas through to implementation.
- Experience successfully executing large events.
- Ability to engage diverse audiences, including senior-level elected officials, both as a discussion moderator and in one-on-one conversation.
- Ability and willingness to both identify obstacles and build systems and structures to overcome them.
- A strong work ethic, with a results-oriented philosophy and personal qualities of trustworthiness, openness, accessibility, kindness, flexibility, and a sense of humor.
- Ability to handle multiple assignments and meet deadlines.
- Ability to pay attention to accuracy and detail while thinking broadly.
- Bachelor's degree is required, an advanced degree is preferred.
- Minimum of five years demonstrated program management experience and leadership.
- Ability to travel (anticipated 15%).
